Avery busy, crowded summer in our Village has now turned into a beautiful autumn with a different pace. But the weekends are still filled with much to do and see in Port Jefferson, with many special events coming up. And like the Village, our employees remain busy all year. They have the everyday job of keeping our Village

Now that the beaches are closed for the season, the Department of Public Works begins the fall with scheduled branch and leaf pick-up throughout the Village during October and November. They keep the entire Village fleet and all equipment ready to meet any weather event or emergency, and maintain the Village roads. Street sweeping and trash pick up are done on a daily basis.

As the seasons change, note the new flowers in the planters along Main Street from downtown to uptown that will thrive until the first frost. Much effort goes into planting, weeding and watering all the public areas from Village Hall, to our parks, and up to the LIRR station. We anticipate new planters for downtown, and more to be placed uptown by spring. We are also in the process of developing an anti-littering campaign to raise awareness to keep our streets clean.

The Capital Campaign for the renovation of our much beloved Rocketship Park is well underway, with a fundraiser concert featuring the Como Brothers to be held at Theater Three on October 29. Tickets are still available online through Theater Three, or can be called in and held for you at the door. We are pleased to announce the pledges continue to come in. ### MILL CREEK RESTORATION

T ong overdue work will commence upon Lissuance of the DEC permit to stabilize approximately 310 feet of our Mill Creek shoreline behind Village Hall. Work will involve removing damaged retaining bulkhead, re-grading the banks and installing vegetated gabions, coir logs and mats. Phragmites and the other invasive vegetation will be removed and replanted with native species. Our Mill Creek is the recipient of our storm water runoff throughout the Village and maintaining its integrity is paramount in our environmental storm water management plan.

Work we hope will commence before winter sets in. This work is funded by a NY State grant with a 25% match of Village funds.
