BAKER'S ALLEY

The Bakers Alley easement and walkway project is well underway. This will connect East Main Street to the Bakers Alley parking lot which will create pedestrian friendly access as our new walkway will connect to Danfords' Founders Park.

This project was also paid by the metered parking fund and a New York State grant, at no cost to the taxpayer.

BAKERS ALLEY PARKING LOT

Construction will start in the month of September for the renovation and improvement of the Bakers Alley parking lot behind the Fifth Season. Improvements will include paving, new lighting, new sidewalks and green space to enhance pedestrian safety and increase walkability.

The project is being paid in full by the metered parking fund at no cost to the taxpayer.

Heritage Weekend



During our first annual Heritage weekend, the Village of Port Jefferson unveiled at our Drowned Meadow House, a letter from Nehemiah Marks to Major Oliver

Delancy which has been authorized and verified that the Roe Brothers were instrumental in providing intelligence to George Washington. This significant information puts Port Jefferson on the map with the Drowned Meadow House as being instrumental in the spy ring which is integral to winning the Revolutionary War.

The Village will have a ribbon cutting reception on September 24th and announce dates through October where the public can come and see this historical letter within the walls of our Drowned Meadow Museum at Barnum and West Broadway.

Re-Creation of 1910 HILL CLIMB

The Village of Port Jefferson with the PJ Harbor, Arts and Education Conservancy hosted the historic return of the 1910 Port Jefferson Hill Climb which the Village hosts every five years commencing the significance of the auto industry in the Village of Port Jefferson. The original ALCO automobile known as the Black Beast participated in the Hill Climb which had won at the Vanderbilt Cup Races in 1905 and 1906.

This year's first annual Heritage weekend also featured our PJ Fire Department Museum, the Port Jefferson Free Library, Antique Costume & Prop Rental by Nan, Cedar Hill Cemetery, PJ Masonic Temple, the Biddle Fountain, PJ & Bridgeport Ferry and the Drowned Meadow House to name a few. This event was extremely successful and we look forward to the 2nd annual Heritage weekend in 2016.
