# WELCOME TO VILLAGE HALL

A quick how-to...

We welcome you to do your business at Village Hall. When you enter the vestibule, a friendly face will greet you. They will be able to direct you to streamline your process. Here are some common transactions that a resident would do at Village Hall. For your added convenience, there are links to follow allowing you to accomplish most of these tasks from the comfort of your home.

#### In the Front office:

Get your **Resident Parking Sticker**. This is easily done online. https://portjeff.com/residentparking/

Get a **copy of a birth certificate** (if you were born in Port Jefferson after 1964)
This is quickly done online - **CLICK HERE** to download the application, then mail it in or drop it off at Village Hall

or death certificate (if the deceased passed away in Port Jefferson after 1964)
This is easily done online - CLICK HERE to download the application, then mail it in or drop it off at Village Hall

### Get a **Disability Parking Permit**

This is easily done online (to get the form) then mailing in the application. To get the application - <a href="CLICK HERE">CLICK HERE</a> or in-person

### Pay your **Property Taxes**

This is quickly done online **CLICK HERE** (have your tax bill ready) or in-person

Business with the Assessors office -

Get information about your property tax assessment, including exemptions for seniors (65 years and older) and Veterans. Exemption application period is November 1<sup>st</sup> through December 31<sup>st</sup>. Assessment grievance applications are accepted from January 1<sup>st</sup> through the third Tuesday in February.

#### In the Court Office:

The most common reason to interact with the **Court Office** is to pay a violation that you have received. These include **Parking tickets**, **traffic violations**, **and other fines**.

#### **Traffic tickets & Other Fines**

Some traffic tickets may be paid online without the need to come to court. Village ordinance tickets and building/fire code violations require a court appearance. Village Court is held on the first and third Tuesday of each month at 6:00 PM. After you have been to court, you may pay @ www.GovPayNow.com or (888) 604-7888, 24 hours 7 days a week.

**PAY LOCATION CODE for govpaynow.com is 8970 for Judge Reilly and a00368 for Judge Higgins.** Please make payments to the PLC of the judge who heard your case in court. If you are unsure which judge was present, please call the Court Office to verify.


# **NEW BEACH CLEAN UP STATIONS INSTALLED**


Cleaner, Greener, Port Jefferson


A lot of computer users like to have multiple programs open at once. You can use the split screen feature to do a multitude of things. You can compare two documents or view two websites simultaneously. You can have a spreadsheet open on the left while your word processing program is available on the right. You can even browse your favorite social network while watching YouTube videos or doing some shopping while checking your emails. The possibilities go on and on!

Our tech tip shows you how to split your screen between two windows. We hope this makes your computing a little easier!

#### For Windows:


#### 1. Select a window you want to split your screen with

Click on the window you want to take up a portion of the screen. Drag the window to the left or right, depending on which side you want it to be positioned.




#### 2. Select a second window

If you have more than one window open when you complete step 2, they should appear as thumbnails on the other half of the screen. Just select whichever one you want to take up the remaining half of the screen, and it will automatically fill the space.



#### 3. Drag the divider to your preference


If you want one window to be bigger/smaller than the other. Just click on the thin dividing line between the two windows and drag it either left or right to match your needs.



#### For MAC


#### 1. Select a window you want to split your screen with

Then click and hold the Full Screen button in the window's upper-left corner. Then choose the side you want that window to be on, either the left or right side of the screen.




#### 2. Select a second window

# A life well lived





# SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

Protecting our streets and parks is a top priority. Our 'See Something - Say Something' campaign is designed to make you a part of the solution. Signs are being posted throughout Main Street, in both uptown and downtown areas. The phone number of the supervising Code Officer is prominently displayed on each sign. We encourage residents to report any suspicious activity or other hazards. If you see something unusual or witness any concerning behavior, call (631) 774-0066. The Code Enforcement Bureau will secure the scene



immediately, investigate the situation and work with SCPD. Our Code officers have a well-established relationship with SCPD. Many of them are retired, active or auxiliary officers. We also have security cameras on our streets. SCPD's real-time crime center is tied into our camera system and can monitor them when necessary. All crimes are reported to Suffolk County Police. It will take all of us to be proactive and diligent to continue with the good work that has already been established.
