

A Message from MAYOR MARGOT GARANT

With May upon us in a few weeks, spring is in full session with the Village blossoming in yellow daffodils and our cherry and fruit trees opening to welcome the sun. The Board of Trustees unanimously passed a conservative budget with a slight tax increase due to the impact of the loss of revenue from the LIPA Power Plant. Our financial status nevertheless remains strong, and we were able to accomplish many of the planned capital improvement projects

despite struggling through the pandemic. We completed renovations of the bathrooms at Village Hall and Rocketship Park, built a new safety vestibule as you enter Village Hall, finished the addition of a new emergency command center up at the Department of Public Works building, paved many neighborhood streets and restored a large drainage culvert that runs along Brook Road that had collapsed during heavy rains.

Did you know that over 140 Village residents volunteer their time to serve on one of the various boards and or committees? Without them, the wheels would fall off the bus! We are grateful to all our Village volunteers and honored them, as well as our Not-for-Profit partners with a fun-filled recognition dinner at the Village Center. It was so great to be together again in person and I think everyone had a nice time.

There are many events to take advantage of - including our "Winter Tide "free concerts that take place every Friday night at the Village Center sponsored by the Greater Port Jefferson Arts Council and the Village. Concerts begin at 7:30 so you can catch an early dinner or happy hour and then come and listen to folk, country, and some great "unplugged" recognized musicians. Actively applying for grants!

The Village of Port Jefferson has been working diligently for the past several years to address the ongoing erosion issue with East Beach. They are seeking significant funding from various opportunities to offset the cost for the residents.

We have two applications already completed and two more actively in the process. Grants are in motion from Congressman Zeldin's office and Senator Schumer's office. They both have the potential to bring in millions in funding. We also have grant applications out for FEMA and the Department of Homeland Security. FEMA and the Army Corps of Engineers will soon be touring the affected areas. The goal is to repair the havoc that mother nature has given us and get most of it funded from grants.

The Village will continue to pursue all funding sources so the community can be appropriately protected while keeping costs to a minimum.

Paving our roads!



We are pleased to announce our latest road improvements. The paving of our well-traveled streets will be smooth as silk!

Preparation and milling are scheduled to begin on Thursday, April 28th, and Friday, April 29th, weather permitting. Paving will follow on Monday, May 2nd, and Tuesday, May 3rd. Motorists and residents are cautioned that traffic may

experience minor delays and detours during this construction period.

The streets to be paved are:

Broadway

A PIECE OF HISTORY - RETURNED!

A 46-star US Flag was brought back to Port Jefferson







Recently Port Jefferson historian, Chris Ryon, accepted a treasure trove of Port Jefferson history. The Lee Squires family traveled from upstate to make the delivery. They brought photographs, books, and papers from her Great Grandfather and Grandfather, Charles A. and Charles W. Squires, both prominent businessmen in Port Jefferson. However, the prize object is a 13'x6', 46 star US flag that flew over the Echo Post Office where Charles A. Squires was postmaster. The post office was located immediately North and West of the LIRR tracks on Main Street.





It is a rare flag, made for only four years between 1908 and 1912 and will proudly be displayed above the Village Center entryway. This piece of history is a hand-sewn linen flag that made it through two world wars. It was passed down in the Squires family for generations. It is now an important piece of our archives and will remain protected and cherished.

Drowned Meadow Cottage Museum (DMCM)

Immersion into Port Jeffersons Revolutionary War history





Big things are happening! The DMCM team is focused on getting a New York State Museum Charter, and that is a rigorous task governed by the Board of Regents. The designation of a Museum comes with responsibilities and accountability guided by standards under education law. The team has been doing the necessary steps for a provisional charter to the New York Department of Education. Upon successful review, the DMCM application will be advanced to the regent's agenda for consideration.



A provisional charter will allow DMCM to open the doors to students and families to tell, honor, commemorate, educate, and celebrate the heritage of Port Jefferson. The current museum collections consist of acquired and donated artifacts, rare prints, antiquities, objects, maps, documents, transcripts, textiles, memorabilia, instruments, and tools from the early colonial times. The Roe House itself is a surviving Revolutionary War structure making the building itself an artifact and part of the collection.

Here's a preview of the educational programs that will be running. There will be exhibitions, lecture series, author events, and the Turn Academy: Edutainment Brings History Alive. A six-week lecture series comparing the intersection of the historical fiction series of AMC's Turn and how it actually unfolded right here on Long Island.

DMCM is at the beginning stages of the application process and has been preparing for this transition for the last eight years. We are very fortunate to have pieces of history readily available because of the vision and hard work of the DMCM team - The brilliant and accomplished team includes - Dr. Georgette Key-Grier (DMCM Historian and Chief Curator), Mark Sternberg (Historian), Tara Penske (DMCM Director of Education), Chris Ryon (Port Jefferson Village Historian) and under the leadership of Mayor Garant and the Board of Trustees.

With all of these April showers, we can be grateful that we don't have to wait until May for flowers: the Village is already in bloom! Many thanks to the

local volunteers, businesses, and staff who made efforts in the autumn to help bring an early spring to the Village. For anyone interested in Village gardening this year, keep an eye out for the year's first Learn-and-Lend-a-Hand volunteer opportunities to continue cultivation and beautification efforts in the Village's pollinator gardens.

The Six Acre Park Committee continues its work and aims to present a proposal to the Board of Trustees in the coming months. Based on months of research, discussion, and public input, the current vision for the acreage along Highland Blvd is "a passively used arboretum-like parkland with possibility for area used for community gardens. Adjacent existing parking lots will be sought for use to access the park." Public input can be emailed to trustee-kassay@portjeff.com; these comments are entered into a document that is reviewed by the Committee at its monthly meeting. As a Trustee, I am enthusiastic about working with residents and my fellow Board members to find appropriate locations for more active parkland uses; for example,

the residents requesting pickleball courts will be delighted to see a new pickleball program coming to Texaco Park this spring! The next Six Acre Park Committee meeting will be held at Village Hall on Tuesday, April 26th at 6:30 pm.

I am thrilled to continue working with a dedicated group of residents on a special Arbor Day effort. Reaching out to various community 'branches,' we will be introducing hundreds of native Red Oak, White Spruce, and Winterberry (shrub) saplings to the Village in late April and early May to help re-tree the Village. Each member of the Port Jefferson Village School District's first grade class will receive a coupon for one free tree: students can either plant it at their homes to grow up alongside, or plant it as part of a newly established Village tree nursery on the Country Club grounds. Additionally, residents and locals will be able to purchase a "dollar tree" (\$1 per sapling) at the Port Jefferson Farmers Market- date TBA based on sapling delivery. Look for Village social media posts and an article in the Port Times Record for updates on this project.

Hope to see you out and about as the Village trades the winter blues for the spring greens this month! Meanwhile, best wishes for a bright and cheery April.

Hello Port Jefferson Residents,

It's been a busy month.

I have contacted Hector Garcia of the Long Island

Rail Road for a second meeting. This meeting would be with Catherine Rinaldi, the new leader of the LIRR. We would like an update on the Oyster Bay spur's battery electrification experiment and its future application for Port Jefferson.

We are also interested in taking over the LIRR parking lot to make it more attractive as part of the gateway to Port Jefferson and meter the lot and redraw spaces.

A more distant issue pertains to the Lawrence Aviation Superfund site, immediately to our south. One proposal supported by Assemblyman Englebright would move the LIRR rail yards and station to a 40-acre sector of the Lawrence site. This is an interesting proposal as it would eliminate the crossing on route 25 A /112, reduce some traffic coming into Port Jefferson and would end an existing bottleneck when trains arrive and leave.

I have been monitoring the Mather Hospital Expansion and its impact on open space and woodlands. Some residents are concerned about increased helicopter traffic.

The phone number of the supervising Code Officer is prominently displayed on each sign. We encourage residents to report any suspicious activity or other hazards. If you see something unusual or witness any concerning behavior, call (631) 774-0066. The Code Enforcement Bureau will secure the scene immediately, investigate the situation and work with SCPD. Our Code officers have a well-established relationship with SCPD. Many of them are retired, active or auxiliary officers. We also have security cameras on our streets. SCPD's real-time crime center is tied into our camera system and can monitor

them when necessary. All crimes are reported to Suffolk County Police. It will take all of us to be proactive and diligent to continue with the good work that has already been established.
